Street Jesus News: And if somebody asks about your Christian hope always be ready to explain it, but do this in a gentle and respectful way.

1 Peter 3:15-16

Welcome to the May edition of Street Jesus e news. In April we have not been out on the street at all, having had our bi-annual Yard sale here at Featherbroom Gardens on the 7th, four of the team headed down to Minehead for Spring Harvest. We feel that its important to get away to a big Christian festival at least once a year. Its great to meet with so many other Christians and share what is going on in our Churches and various Christian organisations. The Apologetics stream of lectures are particularly helpful to those going out on the street as it equips us with ideas on how to deal with the more awkward

questions that we get asked from time to time. The Pastoral stream is also very useful as we seek to understand some of the issues that people face often on a daily basis, this strengthens our feelings of empathy and compassion as we provide a listening ear for those who may be troubled. I remember on our first ever outreach in Leiston a rather exasperated elderly lady wanted to throw her



husband in the river. It turned out that her husband suffered from Alzheimers disease and had kept her up for much of the previous night, she was just dog tired. We had a chat about what it was like for her. We are not experts in counselling so are not best placed to offer too much advice but people usually just want to offload, get it all off their chest and in this way we act like Jesus in that he tells us that he will relieve our burdens and give us rest and we aim to do the same for others. We pray for or with all those we speak to.

The whole week was very enjoyable and strengthening but the stand out moment was the incredibly moving testimony of a lady from North



Korea. To be a Christian in North Korea is often a death sentence but many are held captive in the most hideous of conditions suffering great cruelty at the hands of the authorities. We were asked not to take photos of her as her close family remain in North Korea and it was feared that they would be severely dealt with if the Korean authorities found out that she was in the UK. She was sustained by the 23rd Psalm throughout her long ordeal, when they worshipped they had to whisper it in the

toilet block with a handful of other Christians whom God had made known to her. After her testimony the whole audience whispered the 23rd Psalm and gave a most quiet rendition of amazing grace

before a most rousing finale. There was hardly a dry eye in the whole place, it really was a very special moment to be in solidarity in some sense with our Christian brothers and sisters in North Korea

Sometimes as Christians we feel that we are being subtly persecuted in this country, there have been many cases now of Christians who have been suspended sacked or charged/convicted of a criminal offence for expressing or acting on their Christian faith. The Christian legal centre has supported many cases in the UK and European courts. The flashpoint is often around, gender, sexuality and sharing or expressing faith in the workplace and we are grateful that there is legal support available for those who find themselves censored in whatever way. Many Street evangelists have been



arrested over these past few years on public order offences, some have been convicted whilst others have been acquitted but it has shown the dangers of Street evangelism of which we are very aware at Street Jesus. We carry a statement of rights issued by the European court

Jesus on the street. Individual Police officers are not always up to speed on the law in this area. I tend to think that Christians are occasionally marginalised rather than persecuted in the UK though a recent survey suggested that 70% of Christian felt inhibited to speak of their faith in the workplace for fear of ridicule or prejudice. Jesus told us that this would be, so we should not be surprised. For all the problems with interpretation of the law and the clash of rights between different groups in society, by and large we have a high degree of freedom here to share our faith. We have that freedom so lets use it. The strap line for Spring Harvest was 'Only the brave' and it does take courage sometimes to speak of and live out our faith but i think we were all hugely challenged by the testimony from North Korea. Would we remain faithful to Christ if our life were in danger or would we be like Peter and deny our Lord?

On Easter Saturday we had a great day at the Felixstowe triangle, we had a number of interesting conversations and raised £100. On April 7th we held our bi-annual yard sale here at Featherbroom gardens in Wickham Market. A total of £500.98p was raised. We were also able to support the fundraising group at the recent Spanish guitar concert at All Saints Wickham Market which raised in excess of £700. All monies went in support of the Beehive.



Looking further ahead to May we will be at the Yoxford mini market on Saturday 12th 10am.-1pm and Framlingham Gala Craft fair in St Michaels rooms on Sunday 27th and the Cream teas and crafts at Hacheston village hall on the Monday 28th 11-4pm on the late May bank holiday. In June we are booked for the Wickham Market fun day on the 2nd Leiston Big weekend on the 10th and Woodbridge regatta which will be held on Sunday 17th. We are in the process of applying for three further events in July and August and will let you know as these are confirmed. We will also be doing a talk at Framlingham Baptist church on April 29th If anybody would like to join us in our outreach or would like us to speak in your church then please contact us.





Since Hope House opened in North Wales in April 1996 it has been offering women the opportunity to break free from long term drug and alcohol addiction and to re-engage with the normal course of everyday life. The founder and first manager was Audrey Rankin whose pioneering spirit and total commitment to her call from God means that Hope House is one of the most successful female residential drug ministries in the UK. Since Audrey tragically died in 2003 her book "Treasures of Hope" has been an inspiration to many. A second book "Voices of Hope" by Fiona Fallon tells the stories of a number of women who have made the journey from depths of despair to a life of true liberty. I will show you my faith by my good deeds" You say you have faith, for you believe that there is one God Good for you! Even the demons believe this and they tremble in terror.
