we have consolidated our outreach and built up some very positive relationships with local churches, communities and venues. We are so thankful that God has been with us along the way, for his provision and the many opportunities we have had to show something of the love of God on the street. We will also be looking to plan our programme for next

year and evaluate where we are and seeking Gods will for the future. At the beginning we felt it was important to get into a rhythm of mission which we feel we are now doing. We will present our yearly report, our yearly accounts and re-elect officers for Chairman, Minute Secretary, Treasurer and Prayer Co- Ordinator. You are more than welcome to come along, we are always glad to explain what we do and are always looking for people with a heart to come out with us into our local community.

We were very pleased to attend Felixstowe carnival for the first time, we had planned to attend both days but strong winds meant that we had to pack up early on the Saturday and we decided not to go on Sunday as it was raining heavily and in any event the programme was



cancelled so it was a wise decision. We spent a good part of Saturday hanging onto the Gazebo and ensuring that the crafts did not get damaged. We felt rather sad for the organisers who work very hard through the year to put the carnival together particularly as the weather broke with a thunder storm on the Friday evening after weeks of brilliant sunshine. We did have some interesting conversations on the day and two very inspiring stories of Gods healing, One lady who had kidney failure and another

with severe mental health problems. In our mission guidelines it states that we desire to be a blessing to people when we go out but so often

we are the ones who end up being blessed.

We learned that just being part of a loving church community brings restoration and that prayer in a conversational way with God even if you do not attend Church is of benefit because the important thing is that you have an active relationship with God through an active prayer life. We have met a number of people over the months whose faith may be considered unconventional, often not Churched but seemingly passionate about Jesus.



Street Jesus News:

We had a visit from a young refugee from Eritrea who had arrived on one of those boats across the Mediterranean sea that we have all seen on the news ,with all the perils that involves.

She has been befriended by a local Christian couple and although she did not speak a word of English having only just arrived in the country her smile spoke a thousand words. She carried a wonderful joy about her. So despite the weather we had great opportunity to learn and be encouraged by others.

It was great to make contact with many Christians in Felixstowe some who were there on holiday and we received great support from our Christian brothers and sisters, The fun and faith marquee organised by Felixstowe Churches together was a great success and we would like to be involved and work more closely with them for next years event.

We had our 'Why follow Jesus' board out which attracted a lot of interest and comment. We raised £78 for the Beehive Nakuru Kenya on the day.

On August 17th we attended the Wickham Market summer market. We had a great day. The 'Top That' game was very popular and one

lady from Holland was delighted to have a go as she used to play the game as a child at home. Beyond this nostalgia the game became a catalyst for a most interesting conversation. One of the players asked how many points he needed to score to have his sins forgiven and to get into heaven. This



touched on something that many people in culture still believe, that somehow we have to work to get into heaven, that we need to be perfectly good to find favour with God. We learned that in some Christian educational traditions the emphasis is very much about guilt and punishment rather than grace and relationship. That punishment brings fear and leaves people with low self esteem. It damages lives and inhibits the Holy Spirit. We were able to talk about different approaches and our recent experience in Church of Children being assured that God still loves them even when they do something wrong. Many adults also need to hear that message.

We raised £205 for the Beehive Nakuru Kenya and were pleased to receive 40 new knitted animals (See above) from the Kenana knitters brought back by volunteers who had recently been working at the Beehive. We sold half of them on the day

In October we plan to attend the Old Jet Saturday morning market at Rendlesham on the 6th 10am-1pm and Framlingham Sausage fest on Sunday October 14th which really is a sizzling event.





Homelessness



The Issue of Homelessness

With the recent extreme hot weather it is difficult to remember the very harsh winter and the plight of individuals sleeping rough in our town. At the time many of us were concerned and wanted to help but were unsure of what to do about it and who to contact for help and advice.

With this in mind a meeting will be held on the issue of Homelessness and how we in Woodbridge might get involved. This will be held at the **Salvation Army Hall in Woodbridge on Wednesday 5th September at 7.30pm.** Julia Hancock, manager of the Selig Trust, will be speaking and giving us information on what support is in place for anyone in our locality who finds they are homeless and may resort to sleeping rough. Julia is very involved with the Ipswich Night Shelter which each winter helps to provide hot food and shelter people. The big issue, however, is the long term need for these individuals and she will bring her experience of what local people can do to help and who we can contact for more support. This meeting is being organised by Churches Together in Woodbridge and Melton and is open to anyone who shares our concern and would like to get involved.

Suffolk's Refugee Support's Resettlement Programme is assisting families from Syria and the Middle East to re-build their lives in Suffolk and are looking for privately rented homes for families who have undergone a 2 year resettlement programme in the UK. All families have successfully managed a home and tenancy for almost 2 years since arriving in the UK and developed the skills to now effectively manage their own private sector tenancy. Each family is stable, debt free and accompanied by a recent landlord reference evidencing their suitability as a tenant.

These families are unable to provide guarantors upon commencement of their tenancies and it is very hard for them to rent through a private letting agency. Many will also still be in receipt of Local Housing Allowance as they transition into work, but Suffolk Refugee Support would help manage your relationship with the families and organize home visits to ensure the condition of the property is maintained.

Are you a landlord with a house to rent and willing to accept resettled refugee families as tenants? Or do you know someone who can help?

Fiona was born in West Kirby and with a talent for dancing from 9 years old attended a boarding school specialising in dance where she studied ballet, jazz, modern and tap dancing and wanted to be a classical ballerina. While performing in shows she met Morecambe and Wise and it was Eric Morecambe who introduced her to the entertainer Roy Castle and a year later when Fiona and Roy married, Harry Secombe was their best man. When she was 35 years old Fiona dropped the children off at school one day, came home and felt so low that she got down on her knees and prayed to God in desperation. At that precise moment a Christian lady that Fiona barely knew telephoned because she felt Fiona needed to talk. Fiona became a Christian and all the anxiety and tension fell away. Roy and Fiona used the

shocking news of Roy's lung cancer as a platform for telling the journalists and media about Jesus. Fiona has written a number of books, including five anthologies of prose and poems, autobiographies and a book on coping with cancer. She has run the London Marathon twice for Oasis Trust, for which she is a patron. Fiona was given an OBE for her work with Global Care and other charities in 2004. 




