unacceptable in an advanced western democracy. It is estimated that human trafficking generates an estimated £104 million, involves 13,000 people 5,145 of whom are referred to the National Referral Mechanism each year in the UK. Less than 1% of traffickers are ever convicted and only 1% of victims are ever rescued. The 21 in A21 represents the estimated 21 million people that are trafficked worldwide each year which is believed by many to be a conservative estimate.

We are in love with a God who believes in justice both the justice of justification for each and every one of us but also in practical ways in our day to day lives. We thank God that he inspires so many Christians to speak out and offer practical help to deal with those who are exploited in this dreadful trade. Let us continue to pray that Gods love will prevail.

This years speaker will be Sandy Millar who was instrumental in setting up the Alpha course at HTB. The event showcases many local Christian organisations and is a great way to find out what is going on locally. Although Street Jesus is unable to make it this year it is an event well worth attending

In our bible passage this month from the book of Matthew we read that Jesus is approached by the pharisees who true to form are trying to trick him into performing a miracle to prove who he is. Their demand for evidence is a sign of needing proof rather than living by faith. Jesus instead refers to the scriptures and reminds them about Jonah and how he spent three days in the belly of the fish, in a foreshadowing of his own death and resurrection. This was to be the ultimate miracle, returning to life from the dead. Jesus further points to the people of Nineveh who had repented of their wrongdoing and the Queen of Sheba who went out of her way to listen to the wisdom of Solomon both of whom would later stand to judge the evil generation of that day.

Its just the same for us. We need to recognise what Jesus has done for us and look to the bible to find wisdom and guidance, and connect with God in our prayers. Unlike Jonah we need to be obedient to what God wants us to do, not do our own thing. There are many things that can trip us up and the passage in Matthew goes on to talk about evil spirits looking to inhabit us. This is why Halloween for example can be so harmful

Finally the Beehive are looking to become a charitable company and officers and trustees working on a voluntary basis will be needed for the smooth running of the charity. Adverts will be out in the new year. If interested Please contact us for further details

One day some teachers of the religious law and pharisees came to Jesus "Teacher we want you to show us a miraculous sign to prove your authority. But Jesus replied "Only an evil adulterous generation would demand a miraculous sign: but the only sign I will give them is the sign of the prophet Jonah. For as Jonah was in the belly of the great fish for three days and three nights, so will the son of man be in the heart of the earth for three days and three nights. The people of Nineveh will stand up against this generation on judgement day and condemn it, for they repented of their sins at the preaching of Jonah. Now someone greater than Jonah is here-but you refuse to repent. The queen of Sheba will also stand up against this generation on judgement day and condemn it, for she came from a distant land to hear the wisdom of Solomon. But someone greater than Solomon is here but you refuse to listen. When an evil spirit leaves someone it goes to the desert, seeking rest but finding none. Then it says I will return to the person I came from. So it returns and finds its former home empty, swept and in order. Then the spirit finds seven other spirits more evil than itself and they all enter that person and live there. And so that person is worse off than before. That will be the experience of this evil Matthew 12:38-45 generation.
