Therefore as we have been made right in Gods sight by faith, we have peace with God because of what Jesus Christ our Lord has done for us. Because of our faith Jesus Christ has brought us into this place of undeserved privilege where we now stand and confidently and joyfully look forward to sharing Gods glory. We can rejoice too when we run into problems and trials for we know that they help us to develop endurance And endurance develops strength of character. And character strengthens our confident hope of salvation. And this hope will not lead to disappointment. For we know how dearly God loves us because he has given us the holy spirit to fill our hearts with his love. When we were utterly helpless Christ came at just the right time and died for us sinners. Now most people would not be willing to die for an upright person though someone might perhaps be willing to die for a person who is particularly good. But God showed his great love for us by sending Christ to die for us while we were still sinners. And since we have been made right in Gods sight by the blood of Christ he will certainly save us from Gods condemnation.
