Street Jesus News:

And if somebody asks about your Christian hope always be ready to explain it, but do this in a gentle and respectful way.

1 Peter 3:15-16

Welcome to the June edition of Street Jesus e news. We hope you too will be filled with the holy spirit as we approach this Pentecost. Its very appropriate that the 'Thy Kingdom come' prayer initiative which is now world wide involving 64 denominations in 114 countries begins on Ascension day and culminates 11 days later at Pentecost.

The events draws on the events seen in the book of Acts 1 where Mary the mother of Jesus and the disciples return to Jerusalem to dedicate themselves to prayer until the Holy spirit comes.

Inspired by this movement and following on from the Spring harvest theme of

Unlimited we had a discussion at our last meeting about our prayer time as an

organisation. Our business meetings are held bi-monthly so we have decided to hold a dedicated prayer meeting on the month in between.

One of the sessions at Spring harvest emphasised persistence in prayer and our need to yearn for the presence of God rather than prayer becoming routine or automatic. With this in mind our first dedicated prayer meeting will be on Monday June 10th 7.30, here at 7 Featherbroom Gardens, Wickham Market IP130JH. You are welcome to join us.



On our facebook page from time to time we get an interesting conversation. A self confessed Atheist recently posted a bible quote from Jerimiah 1:5 which talks about God knowing Jerimiah but his post also added a whole list of tyrants and dictators suggesting that God knew them also, so must have approved of them, was complicit in some way in their behaviour and did nothing to stop them from doing what they did. If God is omnipotent (all powerful) why did he not stop them? He concluded that God did not

care. This is of course is at odds with what we as Christians understand because to us God is a loving God. Its interesting that somebody who does not believe in God, also believed God did not care. The conversation developed into whether God existed or not and the question that God could not be measured verified or proven. At least not in the empirical scientific sense.

God instead is found in the human experience and so much that happens to us is emotional and intuitive, Love is not something you can hold in your hand or examine under a microscope.

He dismissed this on the basis that a physical brain was required and that none of these would exist without one. For us the physical is just the means by which the spiritual can be manifest, required only for Gods kingdom purposes to take place. We could not move beyond our respective beliefs ,his reality was the predominantly physical and



Material whilst mine was spiritual.

In our ministry we often find that a prior commitment to the material is a very common impediment to belief in God. In the Christian life our dedication to prayer opens up another world for us, one in which we can make a connection with God.

Its no good saying 'God is not real' when you have experienced transcendence or if reading scripture has had a profound impact on you. It can be disquieting for some to learn that you have no need yourself to hold a scientific proof of God. At this point in the conversation this atheist man became frustrated and rude.



So how are we to react when we face hostility.?

It is very tempting to fight fire with fire in these situations but that only

generates heat rather than light. We always say that the way we engage with people is very important. Gentleness and respect are vital. I personally was an atheist not that long ago, so I try to remember what i thought then and why i thought it. We try to avoid emotive phrases and avoid 'tit for tat' conversations when working on-line. We often withdraw from conversations after we have made a point or two, hopefully a seed will have been sown. We always pray for that person and hope that God will reveal himself in some way to them. I give thanks to God that he made himself known to me and having discovered the 'Pearl of great price' who wouldn't want to share it with others?

Our outreach at Melton Car boot sale on Saturday 4th was cancelled due to wet weather.

We had a fruitful day at Framlingham Gala craft fair on Sunday May 26th. Lots of conversations about the Beehive, we handed out over 100 Beehive flyers. £61 was raised for the home and £19 for Street Jesus. We took prayer requests and listened to people with various anxieties, particularly around Brexit In June we will be at the Rendlesham Show at Jubilee Park on the 8th and Woodbridge Regatta on Sunday 23rd.



In July we will be at the Ipswich Music day on Sunday 7th all day and Woodbridge Family day out on Sunday 14th which has been organised by Quay church in conjunction with Woodbridge churches together. We will be attending Saxmundham Music festival on Saturday 27th in partnership with the local United Kingdom fellowship church. We have a number of options for outreach in August which we will announce nearer the time though we will be holding our Bi annual Yard Sale on Saturday August 31st here at Featherbroom Gardens, Wickham market. We are hoping to be in Ipswich on September 28th, while in October we will be at Old Jet Bentwaters on Saturday 5th and Framlingham Sausage Fest on Sunday 13th Please do come and visit us wherever we are, You will be most welcome.

Our Bible reading this month is from Jonah 3, where Jonah having spent time in the big fish eventually goes to Nineveh to warn the people about their sin and Gods impending judgement. Jonah who was a rather reluctant prophet had now become obedient. The people, including the King respond in repentance and were truly sorry wanting to make amends. God is looking for these kind of qualities in us. To turn to him and go beyond what we think we can do. all for his glory.





Treasurer Required

Beehive is a unique children's refuge, located in Nakuru, Kenya and supported from the UK. Established 4 years ago by Christian missionaries from Suffolk, The Beehive provides a place of safety in a loving, family style environment for sexually abused girls who as a result become pregnant. These children are referred by the Kenyan social services through the courts. The Beehive provides accommodation, medical care, education and job training for the teen mums and their babies, so that they are skilled and empowered to live a self-sufficient adult life in the community. There are virtually no similar facilities in Kenya so demand is high and the work now provides for some 18 mums and 14 babies, via two rented houses.

The transformation seen in these girls' lives as a result from the care at The Beehive to date has been truly heart warming and inspirational.

This voluntary work has grown and needs to become a registered charity. The work currently has a turnover of some £55Kp.a. but is likely to grow through grant applications. It requires a volunteer trustee treasurer, who agrees with the Christian ethos of the work and will help establish and ensure good financial governance that provides accountability through its business processes and accounts and submit the annual report to the Charity commission and its donors, particularly other charitable trusts and major donors.

As we already use Skype and conference bridges with people in Kenya for monthly meetings, routine face to face meetings are not required, but physical meetings would happen a couple of times a year in Suffolk.
