And if somebody asks about your Christian hope always be ready to explain it, but do this in a gentle and respectful way.

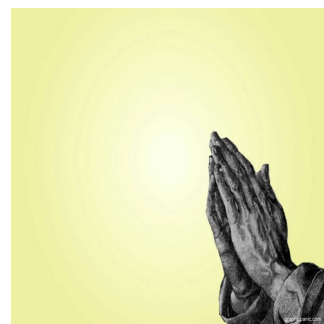
1 Peter 3:15-16

Welcome to the July edition of Street Jesus e news. Its such a beautiful time of the year with many plants, shrubs, flowers and trees looking so lush and colourful. Fruit and vegetables are coming on nicely and I am enjoying a great crop of strawberries each day. A reminder that summer is here and Wimbledon is soon upon us. It's a bit of a cliché to say that we are closest to God when we are in the garden because we can meet with God just about anywhere but it is true that it is an environment conducive to prayer, a place where we can appreciate Gods creation and utilise all our senses. It is a peaceful place where I spend the majority of my working life. Its great of course to see everything growing but that includes weeds and in my case the dreaded ground elder which is almost impossible to get rid of, it's a constant battle. Our spiritual life can be a bit like this. We cannot attain salvation by our own good works but to move toward sanctification we need to put in some effort so that we may grow closer to God. Like gardening it can be hard work to find time for God, particularly if we are going through a spiritual dry spell. In the garden we are inspired by what God has provided, to tend to everything with loving care.



It's the same with prayer as we look to God to guide and inspire us in our endeavours. I was very pleased to be invited to speak at the recent worship service for Woodbridge Regatta. The subject was prayer and the reading was from Luke 11 where it talks about the importance of persistence when we pray. The days when it's a bit wet or cold outside or that you are mowing the lawn only because you are worried that the neighbours might complain, the days when gardening is a chore. The weeds like our sins are choking off our spiritual growth. These are the days when we need to persist. This is a time when you need a prayer buddy, someone who you trust and can be honest with.

We had a very good day at Woodbridge Regatta, we were once again joined by Rob from Presence -Faith on the street along with Doggie who delighted the young and elderly children alike. We were able to do some pastoral support for somebody recently bereaved, took some prayer requests and handed out some literature. We had a lot of interest in the Beehive and learned of other work being carried out in Malawi, Kenya and Peru. A grand total of £170 was raised for the Beehive and an added £8 for Street

Our day at the Rendlesham show was challenging due to the wind and rain and Nick supplied some extra anchorage for the gazebos by strapping them to the Van. The sun did come out in the afternoon and we had a few more visitors. The Top that game was popular as ever. £120.50p was raised for the Beehive and £5 for Street Jesus. We were able to provide some pastoral support, took two prayer requests and 25 Beehive flyers were handed out. Again **Antics at Rendlesham show** we had opportunities to share with people about poverty in Africa.



In July we will be at the Ipswich Music day on Sunday 7th all day and Woodbridge Family day out on Sunday 14th which has been organised by Quay church in conjunction with Woodbridge churches together. We will be attending Saxmundham Music festival on Saturday 27th in partnership with the local United Kingdom fellowship church. We have a number of options for outreach in August which we will announce nearer the time, though we will be holding our Bi annual Yard Sale on Saturday August 31st here at Featherbroom Gardens, Wickham market. We are hoping to be in Ipswich on September 28th, while in October we will be at Old Jet Bentwaters on Saturday 5th and Framlingham Sausage Fest on Sunday 13th. Please do come and visit us wherever we are, You will be most welcome.

We continue to support the Beehive project in Kenya as part of our commitment to those in poverty. The fundraising group with whom we work very closely have a blessings jar outreach. The idea is to fill your jam jar with all that loose change that accumulates in your pockets and purses whilst also praying a blessing over the donation. In excess of £2200 was raised by Blessings jars in the last financial year which is a great help to the wonderful work being carried out there.



We were also very pleased to be able to support the Beehive by attending the Philharmonics concert held at Vineyard church in Ipswich. A great concert at a very friendly church who raised £81 on the sale of African crafts and £310 on the concert itself.

Our Bible reading this month is from Luke 11, a passage which includes the Lords prayer. The Lords prayer was repeated regularly in assemblies when I was at school, i didn't really understand it back then because it was just something that we repeated parrot fashion. We get the impression that because the nature of school assemblies have changed, that the Lords prayer is not so well known among the young these days. It was very encouraging to note though, at the Woodbridge Regatta many were still able to recite the Lords prayer including many young people.

The Lords prayer is a great template for our own personal prayers, Its adoring, its asking, its forgiving and provides us with a great base from which to develop our prayer life.

Our first formal Street Jesus prayer meeting was held on June 10th, in which we were greatly uplifted and encouraged. Our next prayer meeting will be on August 10th to which you are all most welcome

The recently renovated building is owned by The Ansell Trust and is managed as a Day Retreat Centre by a team from the United Reformed Church and St Peter's Church.

THE FACILITIES

There is the main meeting room (seats up to 40) with a small kitchen area (for drinks and plating food), including washing up facilities and linen, along with glasses, crockery and cutlery for 40 people as well as supplies of tea, coffee and sugar.

There is also an electronic organ, keyboard and audio-visual equipment available for use. There are 2 toilets, one of which is wheelchair accessible, and there is space for parking at the front of the building and in close proximity.

THE QUIET PLACE

A short walk from the chapel is a five acre area of water meadow, preserved as a haven for wildlife by one of the centre's management team. In line with the vision and ethos of HOME, The Quiet Place is also available to individuals and groups on day retreat. You can follow a special trail with reflections or just stroll and sit and ponder. The distinctive wet meadow ecosystem is a natural home to special species of butterflies, birds and dragonflies.

Generations of Christian Decline: why it's irreversible



Abby Day is a Senior Research Fellow at the University of Kent where she teaches the anthropology of religion, and also Reader in Sociology of Religion at Goldsmiths, University of London. Her qualitative longitudinal research has expanded conventional views of belief and belonging through empirical research based initially in the UK and extended through cross-cultural comparisons. She and Prof. Gordon Lynch organised the AHRC/ESRC Religion & Society Project 'Young People and the Cultural Performance of Belief'. Her latest book, *Believing in Belonging: Belief and Social Identity in the Modern World* was published in October 2011. She also edited the Ashgate collection, *Religion and the Individual*, 2008, and co-edited *Social Identities Between the Sacred and the Secular*, with Giselle Vincett and Christopher R. Cotter, 2013.
