Street Jesus News:

And if somebody asks about your Christian hope always be ready to explain it, but do this in a gentle and respectful way.

1 Peter 3:15-16

Welcome to the August edition of Street Jesus e news which also happens to be our 50th issue. It seems such a short time ago since we produced our first e-news but it was in fact May 2015 when we started with a two page offering that promoted three local Christian events. Four years later its not uncommon for us to promote in excess of fifty each month as well as a number of active organisations. I am constantly amazed at how much is going on in our Christian communities, how countless people are being served by the local church and often without cost to those receiving the services.

There is not another voluntary organisation like it with regard to social capital in the country.

On a recent outreach in Ipswich a visitor to our stall who happened to be a trade unionist was very critical of the Church both in terms of its wealth and its treatment of those employed by it. Although there may have been an element of truth in what he was saying it was not fair comment to generalise in this way. We were able to talk with him about some of the positive work in which the Church was involved in Suffolk. He was not convinced nor happy about what he was hearing



from us. In the face of this kind of response should we be discouraged from speaking?

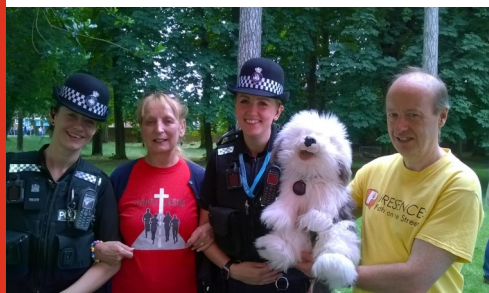
We know through scripture in James 4 that we are not to be proud, so is it then ok to mention or boast about what the church does.? In one sense no, because we are to be a humble people and let our light speak for itself but if we do not convey the positive things that the church does, who will be attracted enough to join it.? In truth we are not boasting about ourselves but rather in what God is doing through us. We clearly understand that all we do and whatever our abilities are is only made available by Gods grace. We give him all the glory.

We have the same sort of attitude with regard to our proclamation on the Street Jesus van. Love Hope Freedom. We are not saying 'look at us we are Christians' but rather conveying Gods message so that people might think about and look into what our faith is all about. We hope that eventually they may receive him and enjoy the abundant life that only he provides. We are pleased to announce that the new Street Jesus van at last has new signage, it has been very well received and we have certainly had a lot more hits on our website since the website address is now included in the new text as well.



Street Jesus News:

We had a very enjoyable day at the Ipswich music day. We had so many conversations with people throughout the day that we barely noticed the music. Rob was again with us with Doggie who proved as popular as ever. We were also joined by Rad who we had also worked with on 'Presence faith on the street' in the past.



We struck up good relationships with the stalls around us including the Samaritans, LGBTQ for youth, the Terrence Higgins trust, the Ipswich

Buddhist centre and a variety of commercial stalls. We always offer chocolates to our fellow stallholders and are now quite famous for it. Ipswich did not let us down, just like last year they ate all the chocolates.

We carried a theme on the cross 'What is your greatest hope for the future' Responses ranged between a Ferrari and Eternity with Jesus. The vast majority were for world peace, equality, and good health. Thirty prayer hearts were posted in all.

We spoke with a street fighter from Romania who met with Christ and who has completely transformed his life. We had a long talk with a humanist philosopher which was absolutely fascinating. Somebody who had worked with refugees in Northern France. We were asked by a group of young people what God thought about Gay people. There were countless other conversations which we do not have space enough to mention but it was a full day and very enjoyable. We handed out over 100 Beehive flyers and ran out of Gideon New Testament bibles. £121 was raised for the Beehive and £4 for Street Jesus.



We were also blessed to be at the Woodbridge Big Family day out which had been organised by Quay church in conjunction with Woodbridge churches together. The day started with a large prayer meeting which was a great way to start an event closely followed by worship music which provided an upbeat backdrop. This is considered to be the Churches gift to the community so was a free event which meant we did not sell African crafts on the day but lots of people did play the 'Top That' game with each contestant receiving a Bible verse, so we were able to explain what it meant. £30 was taken in voluntary donations. Each outreach is different but our main conversations were with Christians. One lady has a son in his thirties who does not yet have a faith but with whom she had spent much of the previous day talking about God with him and he had been quite anti. We always say that asking questions and making criticisms are far better than indifference At least they are thinking about God.

Another we spoke to was about to step out in ministry and was under psychological attack which is very common when Christians are poised to go into the mission field. We are here to support our fellow Christians as well as the public at large.



We were due to attend Saxmundham Music festival last Saturday but unfortunately heavy rain prevented us. Its just not worth risking rain damage to the wooden African crafts. We were particularly disappointed as we were due to work

in partnership with the local United Kingdom fellowship church. Hopefully we will be able to do so at next years event.

Please be aware that the next Street Jesus prayer meeting will be on Monday August 12th at 7.30, not the 10th as previously stated

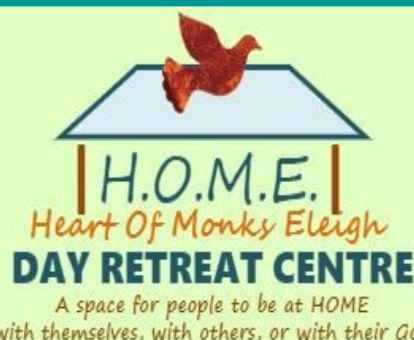

THE VENUE

At the heart of the beautiful Suffolk village of Monks Eleigh is an ancient barn, which was converted into a chapel in the 19th century. The recently renovated building is owned by The Ansell Trust and is managed as a Day Retreat Centre by a team from the United Reformed Church and St Peter's Church.

THE FACILITIES

There is the main meeting room (seats up to 40) with a small kitchen area (for drinks and plating food), including washing up facilities and linen, along with glasses, crockery and cutlery for 40 people as well as supplies of tea, coffee and sugar. There is also an electronic organ, keyboard and audio-visual equipment available for use. There are 2 toilets, one of which is wheelchair accessible, and there is space for parking at the front of the building and in close proximity.

THE QUIET PLACE

A short walk from the chapel is a five acre area of water meadow, preserved as a haven for wildlife by one of the centre's management team. In line with the vision and ethos of HOME, The Quiet Place is also available to individuals and groups on day retreat. You can follow a special trail with reflections or just stroll and sit and ponder. The distinctive wet meadow ecosystem is a natural home to special species of butterflies, birds and dragonflies.

Rev Christine Pinder has been counselling for more than 30 years & runs her own private practice and Footsteps, which provides affordable counselling for young people in Suffolk.

Ann Chadwick taught bereavement counselling to professionals at Suffolk College in the 1970s, having experienced her own family bereavements. She has taught bereavement counselling to a number of different organisations including Cruse & Victim Support.

Nancy Sloan-Capasso has worked all her life in health & social care, as a registered nurse & a counsellor. Initially, working as a neonatal nurse in the Ipswich Special Care Baby Unit & then as a nursing sister in St Elizabeth's Hospice. Since 2010 she has been the centre coordinator for Perspectives, a Christian Charity providing free & confidential counselling for those experiencing difficulties in pregnancy & baby loss. As part of Perspectives work I also work Ipswich hospital maternity dept.

Lynn Hayward and Alex South work for EACH & are based at Treehouse Ipswich. Lynn is a Play Specialist & Alex is the Lead Chaplain. Their work involves universal provision, available for all the children, young people & their families who receive care from Treehouse including one to one work, where needed.

Chris & Sue Monckton-Rickett are Registered Accredited Counsellors, with over 25 years experience. They run WINGS (Wholeness In God's Son), providing counselling, retreat leading & training in counselling, & pastoral care & consultancy. Sue is the Chair of ACC & Pastoral Care UK.

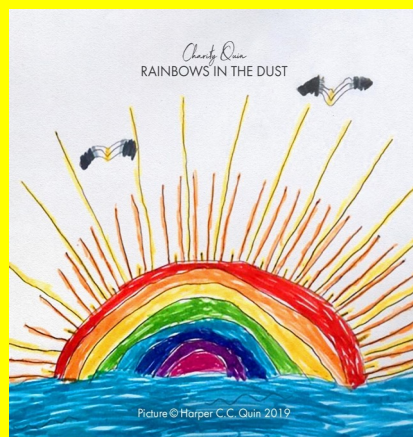
