It's a good opportunity to get away from our normal routine and enjoy a change of environment. One of the great things about this time of year is talking to people about where they have been and what they have been doing whether that be at home or abroad. Its not only that God gives us the sensible injunction to rest from work in a world that seems ultra busy and stressful but also Jesus asks us to rest in him in whatever we are doing. To get to the idyllic holiday destination above we first have to endure the traffic on the journey to the airport, the airport security and the flight. We hope that the end justifies the means but Prayer really is the best way to find that rest. The peace that only God can provide

One of the most encouraging initiatives in recent years is the introduction of prayer spaces into schools. We often read in the press about the increase in mental health issues amongst young people, peer pressure, exam stress and the effects of social media on self esteem. Many believe that our young people are more troubled than any previous generation. Its not only that the young people using the prayer spaces are looking



to something beyond themselves when they feel vulnerable and helpless but they can also see others are experiencing the same kind of problems as them so they do not feel so isolated. Its important for us to express our feelings and a prayer wall or tree is one way to help people do that. Schools that have embraced this initiative report happier students. It's a good way of introducing the concept of God to young people.

We of course display a prayer tree on the Street Jesus stall. it gets well used and we have just replaced our old one which was getting a bit dogeared with a shiny white new one. We certainly get some unusual requests which reflect the true nature and problems in

Our two most recent outreaches at Wickham Market summer market and Aldeburgh carnival were no exception. At Wickham we had a number of requests for healing and were able to pray with two people for physical health issues and another who wanted to be delivered from drug addiction and another from a phobia.

We met a new Christian from Milton Keynes who was on holiday staying in Aldeburgh and had been called to evangelism but didn't know quite how to go about it. We shared some of our experiences but in truth we as an organisation in the beginning went out in faith as we had little or no experience. When we started there was not much discipleship or mentoring available within the church in this area. The early apostles no doubt had not been on a course either but filled with the Holy spirit and inspired by Jesus they stepped out. Anyway we are going to keep in touch with her as a way of encouragement.

Another regular church member who we spoke to did not know Jesus personally and was surprised to think she should, she was encouraged by what we said to her. We spoke to two young women, one who was searching for 'something' and another who had her 'own faith'. We see this kind of designer faith quite often now, a God of our own making, a comfortable kind of God along with the idea of being a free spirit. We always say that Gods holy spirit is free, his spirit of love is freely given. And yet there is a cost to carrying the cross. We again met people who had worked in Africa, one lady as a midwife who was so very aware of the plight of sexually abused girls in Africa. £176 was raised for the Beehive and £25 for Street Jesus.

We were very pleased to do our first ever outreach in Aldeburgh on carnival day. Although we did not have quite the number of conversations as we often do, we had a very enjoyable day at this wonderful event. We received a great testimony from Andy who runs 'Men in sheds' A Church without walls project in Brightwell aimed at men who feel that they do not fit well into the traditional church environment. They offer praise in a barn, share fish and chips and invite interesting speakers. I have been and it really is a great night.



We again met people supporting work in Africa in the exceptional Wototo project and many of you may have had the pleasure of seeing the Wototo childrens choir in action locally. We pray to God that our own Beehive project may continue to grow and prosper. £150 was raised for the Beehive and £5 for Street Jesus.

By the time you read this newsletter we will have had our Yard sale and we pray that it will have been fruitful for the Beehive project.

At our AGM we will be presenting our yearly report, our accounts and electing a Chairman, minute secretary and treasurer for the next twelve months. We will be putting plans in place for our outreach in the coming months and would love for you to come along and get involved. Please join us in committing all our activities to prayer, all for Gods glory

The recently renovated building is owned by The Ansell Trust and is managed as a Day Retreat Centre by a team from the United Reformed Church and St Peter's Church.

THE FACILITIES

There is the main meeting room (seats up to 40) with a small kitchen area (for drinks and plating food), including washing up facilities and linen, along with glasses, crockery and cutlery for 40 people as well as supplies of tea, coffee and sugar.

There is also an electronic organ, keyboard and audio-visual equipment available for use. There are 2 toilets, one of which is wheelchair accessible, and there is space for parking at the front of the building and in close proximity.

THE QUIET PLACE

A short walk from the chapel is a five acre area of water meadow, preserved as a haven for wildlife by one of the centre's management team. In line with the vision and ethos of HOME, The Quiet Place is also available to individuals and groups on day retreat. You can follow a special trail with reflections or just stroll and sit and ponder. The distinctive wet meadow ecosystem is a natural home to special species of butterflies, birds and dragonflies.

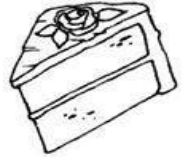

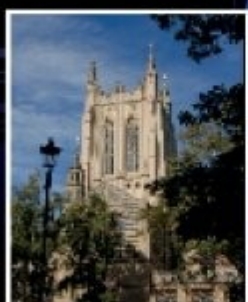

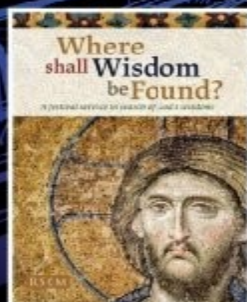

How to get there:

If you use sat nav the location is IP10 0QF. It is named Sluice Farm, but is a COTTAGE, not the farm. It nestles next to some large disused barns so may well look like a farm!

In detail: Drive to Kirton, and travel north through the village along the main Bucklesham Road in the direction of Bucklesham. Just past the north end of the village look for a sign post pointing to Park Lane. Turn east or right down Park Lane. Sluice cottage is a further 1.4 miles, passing the construction site and yellow warning notices. Drive down Park Lane until you reach a crossroads with a white bungalow in front of you, and turn left there. Drive to a crossroads of farm tracks and turn right. Ignore the sign saying "Footpath only", we are visiting the farm!

- Drive down that track towards 2 large grain barns, and turn left between the first two and the third barn, there is a sign on the verge pointing left to Sluice Farm and cottages.

- Drive down that track, and you will see a drive to the cottage on the left just before a grey barn. If disabled please park in our drive,

- otherwise please follow signs past our drive about 15 yards, and turn left and go between 2 gate posts onto our grass car park.

As part of Perspectives work I also work Ipswich hospital maternity dept.

Lynn Hayward and Alex South work for EACH & are based at Treehouse Ipswich. Lynn is a Play Specialist & Alex is the Lead Chaplain. Their work involves universal provision, available for all the children, young people & their families who receive care from Treehouse including one to one work, where needed.

Chris & Sue Monckton-Rickett are Registered Accredited Counsellors, with over 25 years experience. They run WINGS (Wholeness In God's Son), providing counselling, retreat leading & training in counselling, & pastoral care & consultancy. Sue is the Chair of ACC & Pastoral Care UK.

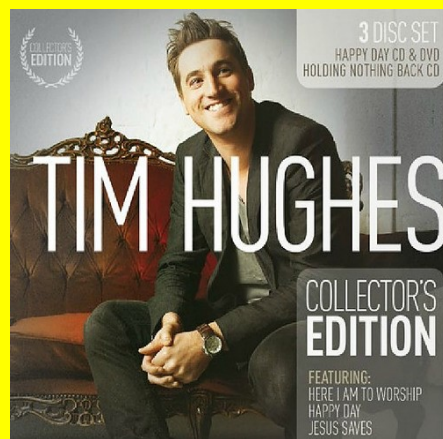

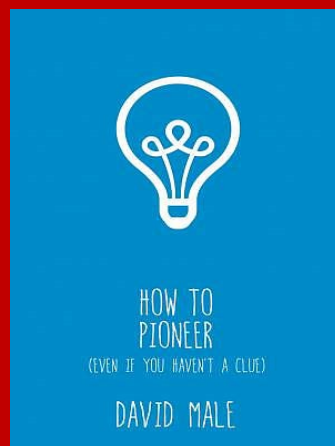
