Street Jesus News:

Welcome to the August edition of our e-news.

We are certainly living in unprecedented times and as we emerge from Covid 19 lock down we do so carefully as we have no wish to become infected ourselves nor to infect others. We are now being asked to wear masks in enclosed public spaces as we begin to have more contact with one another. There is still a lot of anxiety in many quarters and a reluctance to do too much to soon. The Prime minister has expressed his concern of a second wave of infections but also wants to get the economy kick started so not to saddle us with a deeper recession than

is necessary. The mask can be a symbol both of fear or reassurance which is no doubt with us until a vaccine can be found.

We have received some comment with regard to suspending our Street operations suggesting that we should trust God to protect us when we are mixing with the public out on the

Street. Its worth noting that many Christians including pastors have died from the disease. Because of the way we work we are in very close contact with visitors, when we pray with people , when we play top that and while we are selling we are handing over goods which may

be a source of infection. Our prayerful attitude is that we show love best to people by protecting them and not increasing their anxiety. Our experience has been that many people have realised just how fragile we are and that the material things that we base our life on can be taken

from us so easily. This has given us many opportunities on line to communicate the gospel and we have had more

conversations about death than before.

I rarely write on a personal level but since my last newsletter my Mum died on July 8th after a long illness having had a stroke five years ago and been bedridden since last October. Her quality of life was very poor. Death is not a subject we like to talk about but my Mums passing has allowed me to have those kind of conversations with people who do not have a faith including those in my own family. A few months before my mum had her first stroke in

2005 I had an extraordinary conversation with her. Having returned from Church i told her how good the sermon had been and she simply replied "Jesus died for my sins" I knew that she watched Songs of praise every Sunday but I had no idea of the depth of her faith which

she began to be increasinally open about in her last days

She remembered a great deal of the teaching. She told me that she prayed often. She spoke about how my Nan used to take her to Church twice every Sunday as a girl but that she had not continued after she



married as my Dad had no faith. It was interesting that she held Jesus so close to her heart but never mentioned it. Latterly we got into the habit of reading scripture and praying together, she had the Lords prayer and the serenity prayer by her bed which she read many times during the day. My Mum was a woman of great patience and gentleness, she displayed much of the fruit of the spirit and she lived the serenity prayer out in real life. She was very loving and she knew where she was going.

As I gave the Eulogy at her service of celebration last Monday I was confident that she was with Jesus while others close to me clearly did not have that same hope or belief and were visibly feeling their loss. That's not to say that I was not sad, there is a huge gap in our home without Mum but the day was not about my feelings but rather her rising to Glory, a cause of celebration. This is incongruous if you do not have faith in God, almost inappropriate.

But the questions and comments came "Where has her energy and life force gone? "what is heaven like",? "does everyone go there".?" All of life's endeavours seem pointless" "You just go in a hole and that's the end" When confronted by death of a loved one our own mortality comes sharply into focus. For some fear kicks in.



An atheist recently told me its all pie in the sky when you die, Gods not real. Just do your best while you are here.

Jesus tells us that the kingdom of heaven is at hand, it is something we can reach out to, that we get a foretaste of in this life. The sense of his presence and love in our time, both in the word and in prayer is a reality. It's a confidence in somebody who is not seen but rather experienced which continues beyond our mortal coil. How do we convey this to people with n o faith?

When we are talking with people on the street, these kind of






scenarios are discussed. Finding sensitive words is always a challenge for those who are experiencing grief. We know that God does not make everything hunky dory, life is still tough in this instance but our message is that God is with us in the messy business of life. At the end of a conversation we will often say "If you decide to take Jesus into your heart you will never regret it." Its this relational aspect where we meet Jesus not just in the rules and regulations but by his spiritual presence which brings healing.

Our bible passage today from 2 John:4-13 focusses on the command to love one another and this love can be painful when we lose somebody we care about but we realise that he loved us first and God has purchased us at great cost. As well as thanking my Mum for being such a great mum i was able to thank God for the gift of her life. It is by his grace that abundant everlasting life exists. Amen!!! At Street Jesus we are continuing to suspend our activities and will be reviewing our situation in September. We have been invited to a couple of Christmas markets so we will need to make a decision on when we can go out again. In any event our online work has carried on and we have enjoyed some very interesting conversations. We are receiving a lot of prayer requests and we ask God to minister to all those in need.
