Street Jesus News:

Its been very encouraging to see things beginning to get back to normal, whatever normal may mean as many would say its not very normal to go back to rushing around like mad things. So many different aspects of life have been changed by Corvid 19, for example workplace

practices have been reconfigured as many continue to work from home. We can see that everything is connected to everything else in that town centre coffee shops for example are suffering because people are not going into the office. GP's are not seeing so many people in their surgeries and I have heard of a number of people sending in photographs of visible ailments



in order to get a diagnosis and the appropriate treatment. Its interpersonal contact that has been reduced for many people and so it has been with Church which has adapted brilliantly by live streaming services and this has kept us connected and interested. But there really is no adequate substitute for us meeting in person. The feeling of raising the roof in worship together. I had some idea that



at a given point we would all go back together in a joyous reunion hungry for the corporate. Instead Churches are gradually opening for private prayer with some socially distanced services but with no singing. There is something about singing that elevates the soul and I personally really miss it. We do it of course during the online services at home but

most often succeed only in driving the cat out of the room. Attending Church is also a spiritual charging point, we somehow spark off one another and I believe God works among us when we are together.

So how are we filling the gap, how are we staying connected to God? I have found the various posters including sermons and commentaries on the Street Jesus facebook page very encouraging, which has reminded

me to stay in the word. I have very much enjoyed posting a worship song from you tube each day and the Ministry of music keeping us up to date with all the brilliant yet relatively unknown Christian artists out there,



We have also put out a daily Christian quote as encouragement and try to highlight the work of a Christian ministry or organisation each day. Their practical work of love in action continues despite the pandemic. A news article to help us think about how we fit in to the culture at large and how we apply Christian principles in practical terms when our beliefs are at odds with the world. These often stimulate discussion on the forum. We also have a daily devotional on our website. Another site that I have visited every day is Network Suffolk which is brilliant at keeping us informed of what is going on in the county, day to day we post their articles. There are many things that we can do to stay in

Many have been reflecting on the actual nature of Church and asking the question. How effective is it in its current form? I recently had an interesting chat with a Christian couple who have just moved to Leiston on this very subject. Lockdown had given them time and space to pray and ask ' How do we reach the lost? Do we even think it

important or is it just too difficult in a culture that is leaving Christianity behind. How are we encouraging the next generation and in 10 years time what will be the average age in the vast majority of



our Churches. Do we care enough about the future of the Church and has it become primarily a place of comfort for us?

This is the conversation we must continue to have as a Church. There are some great initiatives like Cafe church, Forest Church and Messy church which encourage families where the presentation of the Love of God is less theological, where the language and rituals are less





alien, where community is built, where interest is created but through which faith can be explored in a less traditional environment.

The Lords prayer, the creeds and the Eucharist are extremely important but completely baffling for a new person coming into Church. Church should not just be about us, but rather a vehicle to save the lost. This dear couple recommended a book by Torben Sondergaard called the Final reformation

which reminds us of the nature of the early church as seen in the book of Acts. It also inspires us to see how this could look today. The early Church was essentially a series of house churches, it was a

tight knit community rooted in their community. They were radically generous selling their possessions to give to others. They stuck fast to the teachings of the Apostles. They were steeped in prayer and daily shared the love meal, breaking the bread and taking the wine together. They were clearly holy spirit led, they worshipped and were known for their joy but most importantly were constantly adding to their number and making new disciples. How many new disciples are we making in our churches?



Some Christian groups are practicing open house on the estates where they live, building relationships and looking to help people in practical ways by showing the love of Christ. The Eden project, part of the message trust work in many of our inner cities getting alongside people giving love support and practical help. In other places open houses are springing up where Christians share their homes with their community. This is a real challenge for us as we ask ourselves 'How sacrificial are we prepared to be for the kingdom of God' Our bible reading this month relates to the Israelites camping at Mount Sinai, they were grumbling and had forgotten that God had rescued them from their cruel slavery in Egypt. Moses is asked by God to strike the rock, as a result the water flowed and the people were no longer thirsty. The Rock we see as Jesus, he too was struck but what flows from that action is the waters of the Holy spirit, the well that bubbles up from within. This is seen most vividly in the story of the Samarian woman at the well. This is what guides us as to Gods purpose for our life, just as God gave Moses the purpose of leading the people to the promised land. This too is our desire.

We have recently been hearing from some of the venues where we traditionally attend Street events. These have largely been cancelled including those at Christmas, largely due to the problems maintaining social distancing. We are looking at doing some non-event Street work and will keep you posted. 


