Street Jesus News:

Welcome to the May edition of our e-news.

Its good to be back composing e-news after a break in April. On a personal level its been a rich month in terms of evangelism with many opportunities to share Jesus. The main themes of discussions has been loneliness in lockdown and the often stated idea that people believe in a spiritual energy in their lives. "I'm a spiritual person" is a phrase I have heard a lot recently but this spirituality is not linked with God or

Jesus in any way. In reports these last few years it has often been stated that the number of people who believe in God has fallen dramatically. Should we be concerned about this? Given the nature of todays media and various cultural messages we should certainly not be surprised and whilst people often say they do not need



God, most often the conversations we have start with an expression of emotional pain or anxiety. There is clearly a spiritual need in many people so why do people reject God? In most cases those people have a Church experience or background. So why do many reject the church? Is it the teaching that is too challenging, is it the environment that is



too alien or is it us as Christians who are unappealing? When I first came back to Church in 2007 I was hugely challenged by the teaching and I would say that I was convicted by it but its also seemed quite complex to me and not easy to understand. It took a long time for me to understand the limitations of the law and rules and regulations and take on board the amazing concept of Gods

grace. The idea that we get a blessing that we don't deserve seems almost scandalous and the whole edifice on which your life has been based is turned upside down. Church culture including its rituals, is very strange to the uninitiated. As a result I can relate to people who

find church difficult.

What helped amidst all this strangeness was the sheer friendliness of the people in Church and the thing that moved the dial forward was not the formality of Church or the rituals but the relationships i formed particularly in

the home group i joined. It was a gradual process of enlightenment and growing closer to God in a safe non-judgemental environment.

The question that bugs me is about how Church can remain true to the teachings of Christ yet offer something that is initially attractive for people to begin this wonderful journey of exploration. This journey has led me to the pearl of areat price and God has given me and many

and its been great to meet with brothers and sisters again, catching up with what's been happening in their lives. On line services have served a purpose but there is nothing like meeting in person. It will be intriguing to note how lockdown will have affected how we do church, One of the things which has proved beneficial in

things which has proved beneficial in bringing people into church has been contemporary styles of worship like café church, these tend to be theologically less exacting but more centred on community, are interactive and quite fun. The idea being that relationships are forged first and that the teaching is explored in the less formal setting of home groups.

Will those extra people who have accessed on line services take the next step of actually attending church but just as important how can they be encouraged onto the road of discipleship. What will church be like in the months ahead, will there be changes because sometimes a break allows for reflection.

For the upcoming generations. Will churches be vibrant communities that inspire or will they become empty and derelict?

Its very frustrating not to be able sing in Church but somebody



recently told me that they were still singing Gods praises in their hearts which I felt was a lovely sentiment. We did however meet outside in a socially distanced way during our service here in Wickham Market last week to sing 'In Christ alone' There is something great about singing praises in a more public way and have always enjoyed those Church events like Praise in the park. Perhaps every church

should have at least one service outside each year

I bumped into a young family in the village the other day who confided that they had been struggling recently, They were so

grateful that the Church was running the Box of hope scheme to help put food on the table. It is more often these acts of love and kindness that will draw people to faith than declarations or theology.

As much as we are concerned about what happens in church its our reaching out which is just as important. We gather to



Our missions for the rest of the year will be restricted by the fact that many local events that we routinely attend will not be taking place but there are other avenues that we will be able to explore. Our bible passage this month is a famous scripture from Ecclesiastes 3 A time for every purpose under heaven. This tells us that there are different seasons for different things. Covid has heightened this sense of season. It was brought home to me recently following the death of my father as we reflected on his life and all that it contained. Whatever season we are in we know that God can be with us, whatever challenges there may be. He has planted eternity in our hearts and he wishes us to enjoy the fruits of our labours particularly when we see these as a gift from him, that we may be thankful.
