Street Jesus News: Welcome to the May edition of our e-news.

What a wonderful Easter. Very much enjoyed the March of witness around our village with Evangeline our Street Jesus van leading the procession. Despite not having the Boys Brigade band with us this year we stopped enroute to sing songs. It was such a lovely day as was our service of reflection afterwards. This was

We were very excited to be going again and in no way were we disappointed. The theme of Restore, Renew and Rebuild was so appropriate given the challenges of the past two years. So much in the way of ministry has been stopped or curtailed and we as a group have been very aware of the need to reenergise our work. When we Rebuild sometimes we are required to do a new thing. This has planted a seed in our minds about how we may do our ministry differently in the future.



The bible teaching was outstanding with Cris Rogers (pictured ) leading the daily study. This years passages were taken from the Book of



Nehemiah. We had done a series on Nehemiah in our church quite recently which was very good so I wondered how much in the way of new insights I could actually gain. This is the wonderful thing about Spring harvest though, the teaching is of very high quality and thought provoking. God declares on many occasions (most notably in Isaiah) that he is planning a new thing which we now know to be the life death and resurrection of Jesus as central to his salvation plan but in Nehemiah we see the prophet prompted

by God doing an old thing, ie Rebuilding the temple. Could it be that sometimes we have to revert to an old thing., something tried and tested. Whether our mission is something new or something old we need like Nehemiah to be sure that it is what God wants us to do.

One of the great things about Spring Harvest is the Big start, an early morning service with a difference involving sketches, music, dance and

which this year portrayed the story of Nehemiah rebuilding the wall with both goodies and baddies involved. This year people of all ages were urged to dress up as super hero's to join GIFT (Gods International Fix it Team ) to follow Jesus, the one true superhero. Everyone joined in the sprit of it which was great fun. Much of it was quite silly but the serious point was to

remind us that we are all part of Gods team, called to support and love all those in need.

The evening worship was led by Jake Issac and Lucy Grimble, under

the name 'Us and Him' singing some new songs but also some old favourites. The atmosphere was brilliant in the main venue Studio 36 with some sessions being recorded for BBC Songs of praise. There is something very special about worshipping with thousands of other Christians.



The Seminars were also very

interesting and varied and it was quite difficult to decide which ones to attend. Subjects included Generosity, personhood, identity, struggling with faith, the place of surrender, resilience, street pastors, Church planting just to name a few. The evening



entertainments included comedy, song, theatre, chat shows all of which provided diverse ways of sharing the Christian message. All the teaching is available from essential Christian who provide multiple ways of hearing the sessions. An MP3 is available

Each year Spring Harvest support a Christian mission and this year it was Open doors who support the persecuted church all across the world. We heard of the challenges of Iraqi Christians who are being persecuted and killed in significant numbers, we heard of some very brave individuals who risked torture or certain death if they did not renounce Christ. The videos we were shown were quite disturbing and



it made us realise that we live in a country whilst sometimes marginalised, we are in the main not likely to be killed for our faith. Despite being in a hostile environment and in a minority many Iragi Christians display




illuminated crosses on their homes, a real act of courage and witness.

For those of you who have never been to a big Christian festival like Spring Harvest or New wine we would recommend it, not just as a way of recharging the spiritual batteries but also to be inspired. Many people commit themselves to God at Spring harvest, many are anointed and commissioned to do new work, others have something planted in their hearts which in time grow into some kind of ministry. We ourselves will be looking to see if we can add something to our own ministry as a result of what we have learned at Spring harvest.

I recently had a conversation with somebody in mixed company, somebody talking about their past and the negative effect it had upon them. At one point they said they felt lost. This is why we exist, to share Jesus with the hurt and the lost, so we move forward with renewed enthusiasm to share Jesus that he may heal those hurts. Sadly our outreach at the Rendlesham church fun day was postponed and we were unable to fix something else up at short notice. We are however looking forward to the Funday at Woodbridge football club on Sunday May 22nd 12 noon—4pm in aid of SSAFA the armed forces charity. We would love to see you there. 
#### BOOK OF THE MONTH

#### Bible reading

At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked who is the greatest in the Kingdom of heaven. He called a little child and had him stand among them. And he said I tell you the truth unless you change and become like little children you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Therefore whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. And whoever welcomes a little child like this in my name welcomes me. But if anyone causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin it would be better for him to have a large millstone hung around his neck and to be drowned in the depths of the sea. Woe to the world because of the things that cause people to sin. Such things must come but woe to the man through whom they come. If your hand or your foot causes you to sin, cut it off and thow it away. It is better for you to enter life maimed or crippled to have two hands or two feet and be thrown into the eternal fire. And if you eye causes you to sin gouge it out and throw it away. It is better for you to enter life with one eye, than to have two eyes and be thrown into he fire. See that you do not look down on one of these little ones. For I tell you that their angels in heaven always see the face of my father in heaven. The son of man came to save what is lost. What do you think / If a manm owns a hundred sheep and one of them wanders away, will he not leave the ninety nine on the hills to look for the one that wandered off. And if he finds iot I tell you the truth, he is happier about that one sheep than about the ninety nine that did not wander off. In the same way your father in heaven is not willing that any of these little ones should be Matthew 18: 1-14
