Street Jesus News: Welcome to the December edition of our e-news.

I recently did a talk at a mens breakfast at a church in Felixstowe. In preparing the talk i was drawn to the encounter that Phillip had with the Ethiopian Eunuch. The Ethiopian Eunuch was reading from the book of Isaiah in his carriage. He was a treasury official, clearly an

educated man but he did not understand the scripture as a foreshadowing of Jesus. Phillip prompted by the holy spirit explained it to him. The Ethiopian Eunuch went away enthusiastically worshipping God. There are some parallels with Jesus encounter with the Samarian woman at the well where Jesus explains to her the living waters after which she excitedly runs back to her village telling the people all about him. In both cases they receive the holy spirit but interestingly Phillip is



prompted by the Holy spirit to engage in the first place. It is the same for us all, in that we may not all be evangelists but we are all called to evangelise. We need to be open to the promptings of the Holy spirit as Phillip was and mindful of the opportunities that God places before us.

During our talk we asked a lot of questions about our faith and how things are now. Questions like. Is our faith taught well in schools. Is our faith represented well in the media. Is our faith prominent or even



properly understood in the political powers and authorities. Can we speak freely about our faith without being marginalised or deemed a bit weird. Are stereotypes and caricatures about our faith common. Do we have enough young people and families in our churches. What will church attendance look like in 20 years time. Each of us will have a view on these subjects but our bottom line is Do were love and


care for people enough to share our faith with them albeit in a respectful and gentle way that they too will come to know the Lord.

The picture (Right)depicts census forms being collated before computerisation. Meantime. Another recent study reveals an interesting statistic, that 1 in 6 atheists still pray. Who are they praying too? There are times in life where people need to reach out, often at a time when life is beyond our control, there is a pleading. Even for us as Christians there is a need to plead, to plead for our communities, out nation and the wider world. For healing hurts, for reconciliation and to humble ourselves and repent.



The season of advent is now upon us. Candles are being lit in homes and churches across the world in preparation for marking the birth of Christ. The advent ring or wreath is a longstanding tradition believed to have begun in the middle ages. The ring itself symbolises Gods eternity, the immortality of the soul and everlasting life in Christ. The

evergreen decoration symbolises life itself. Laurel for persecution and suffering, Pine holly and yew for strength and healing and pine cones

for resurrection. The four advent candles represent 1) Hope, it points to the prophets and the ultimate prophesy that Jesus the messiah is coming. The second candle represents 2) Faith, also known as the Bethlehem candle to represent the faith that Mary and joseph had. The third candle often known as the shepherds candle represents 3) Joy and is pink in colour unlike the other



three which are purple. The third Sunday in advent is often known as Guadete as it marks the joy of the birth of the Christ child. The fourth candle represents 4) Peace also known as the Angels candle to reflect 'Peace on earth and goodwill to all men'. There is a further candle lit on Christmas eve, white in colour to represent the purity of the sinless saviour, to mark the birth of Jesus Emmanuel God with us.

We often stress the importance of prayer in the Christian life. Many Christians will say that they do not pray enough nor spend enough time reading the Bible, for many the business of life just gets in the way. Too many distractions. It is often when we are in a spot of bother



you all a joyful and peaceful Christmas.

that we are more likely to reach out to God but perhaps he is not so much to the forefront when life is going well. A couple of people recently have told me that life feels so desperate that they cannot feel that there is a way through. Life feels hopeless. One of the things that helps us to maintain a healthy prayer life is to have a prayer buddy, somebody who will encourage you and with whom you can



In understanding that there is a way, truth and a light we ignite the hope that is represented by the first candle of advent.

We will however be spending time with our Christian family as we help provide a Christmas meal in the church for those in our community. Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Rise and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." This is a desert place. And he rose and went. And there was an Ethiopian, a eunuch, a court official of Candace, gueen of the Ethiopians, who was in charge of all her treasure. He had come to Jerusalem to worship and was returning, seated in his chariot, and he was reading the prophet Isaiah. And the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over and join this chariot." So Philip ran to him and heard him reading Isaiah the prophet and asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" And he said, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to come up and sit with him. Now the passage of the Scripture that he was reading was this: And the eunuch said to Philip, "About whom, I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?" Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning with this Scripture he told him the good news about Jesus. And as they were going along the road they came to some water, and the eunuch said, "See, here is water! What prevents me from being baptized?" And he commanded the chariot to stop, and they both went down into the water, Philip and the eunuch, and he baptized him. And when they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord car Philip away, and the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he passed through he preached the gospel to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.
