Welcome to the July edition of Street Jesus e news. We had a busy yet enjoyable time over the bank holiday weekend. We were outfor the Wickham market music day 'Party by the pitch'. It was great to see everybody enjoying themselves and the community coming together. It was our quietest day yet on the stall but we did have an interesting conversation with another Christian on the nature of the old testament and how it can appear very harsh compared to the new. She had found Nicky Gumbels bible commentary very useful in helping to give some perspective. Our book of the month is recommended by Street Jesus supporter Pam Jenkins which gives a very lucid account of the old testament. Its important to be able to speak clearly on the subject and Pam believes this is an excellent resource to help us answer some of those more awkward questions. Rather aptly we have been discussing the book of Job in relation to human suffering on our Facebook page this week

On bank holiday Sunday we were at Framlingham Gala craft fair. £77 was raised for the Beehive, we had many conversations about the work there and the problems of mission work in Africa in general. We were able to speak about sponsorship of the girls and their babies and had some enquiries from people on the day. On Bank holiday Monday we were able to join with the Beehive support group at Hacheston cream teas and crafts day. £95 was raised on the day which formed part of the Grand total of £794. It was a great atmosphere with a number of craft stalls attending as well as Joules travel agents who are corporate sponsors for the beehive. The games were enjoyed by everyone and the children made good use of the adventure playground. Many thanks to all those who provided the cream teas and refreshments, they were greatly appreciated.

Last Saturday we attended the Halesworth summer market, the first time we had been to Halesworth with the stall. It was a very enjoyable day and were given a pitch directly outside the Halesworth Christian bookshop which is well worth a visit not least because they do coffee's at a very reasonable price. They were happy to carry information about the Beehive on their notice board. We handed out lots of leaflets and had many great conversations about the project and were able to correct some stereotypes and misconceptions about the harsh realities of life in Africa for the poor. We took a number of prayer requests and were able to provide a listening ear to those who were in need. This has become usual on most of our missions. £150 was raised on the day

In these past weeks the country has suffered from political upheaval, distressing acts of terrorism and the unbelievable Grenfell Tower fire tragedy. Unnecessary loss of life has left people feeling fearful and angry and yet the heroic selfless side of human nature was manifest for all to see where people put themselves at risk in order to protect others. We should be rightly proud of our emergency

services for their bravery and courage. The danger is that these events can exacerbate the deep divisions that already exist in our society and it was heartening to hear community leaders and people of

all faiths and none register their determination not to let these events divide us as a society. Archbishop Justin Welby was quick to make this point in his address. The Christain community was very quick to respond in the Grenfell Tower fire disaster. Suffolk churches coordinated efforts to



send gifts of food clothing and donations to help those affected. The Salvation army emergency response vehicle was one of the first on the scene and launched an immediate appeal. The Billy Graham rapid response chaplains moved into the area to pray with the traumatised, , based at Latymer Road Community Church they set up a centre to receive food and toiletries and helped to set up the prayer wall which also became the focal point for the candlelit vigil along with services



at St Clements church.
Where is God in all this? we may ask. When we look into the causes of all these disasters and divisions we see the seed of violence in the human heart and arguably greed and deeply ingrained inequality under pinning those events. We see human ideology whether it be to do with

the unacceptable face of market capitalism or a warped concept of God at its core. God has given us free will but also a guide through his word, the bible and his holy spirit to point us toward a life of love and grace. These events are ultimately a failure of human love. So where was God? He was certainly working through his people to show his love both locally and across the country and beyond, both in terms of practical help and through prayer. We have heard of countless testimonies of gratitude to the support which was given. There is much healing to take place, injustices to correct and a great deal of practical support still to be given.

Let us pray for the comfort and healing of all those who have been bereaved injured and traumatised, that justice will be done, that

lessons can be learned and the root causes addressed.

Let us pray most that we may learn to love one another better, that people will call on the name of God and begin to live by the teachings of Jesus in the power of the holy spirit. That we begin to see more clearly to enable us to draw closer to God who transforms lives for the better and brings alory out of adversity. Blessings Graham




