It seems insensitive to us as Christians when we celebrate the incarnation of the living God on earth in a

profound, serious but joyful way to learn that there is a lack of awareness or crass thoughtlessness about its importance. Afterall you can get Christmas tree baubles with just about anything on them so if everything else is ok then why not Buddha? its just another object. Just another sale in a store. Kerching

We look around and see that the world needs God. The world needs his love to be shown. Yes its good to make the management of a store in Norwich aware that our holy festival is being disregarded and that the reason for the season is not Buddha because he is dead and Jesus is alive. but we also need to demonstrate and explain why we love the Lord

Many will say at this point that Christmas means different things to different people and that the Christmas date was stolen by Christians to assimilate the pagans into Christian adherence. That Christians do not own Christmas and people can adhere to whatever they want even if it's just a week off work with the family. Jesus though is a matter of life and death in all its fullness. Its why we do the work we do. To share and make people aware, to make him known. Please pray for us.



THE FACILITIES

There is the main meeting room (seats up to 40) with a small kitchen area (for drinks and plating food), including washing up facilities and linen, along with glasses, crockery and cutlery for 40 people as well as supplies of tea, coffee and sugar. There is also an electronic organ, keyboard and audio-visual equipment available for use. There are 2 toilets, one of which is wheelchair accessible, and there is space for parking at the front of the building and in close proximity.

THE QUIET PLACE

A short walk from the chapel is a five acre area of water meadow, preserved as a haven for wildlife by one of the centre's management team. In line with the vision and ethos of HOME, The Quiet Place is also available to individuals and groups on day retreat. You can follow a special trail with reflections or just stroll and sit and ponder. The distinctive wet meadow ecosystem is a natural home to special species of butterflies, birds and dragonflies.

Then the Lord spoke to Jonah a second time. "Get up and go to the great city of Nineveh and deliver the message I have given you." This time Jonah obeyed the Lords command and went to Nineveh, a city so large it took three days to see it all. On the day Jonah entered the city he shouted to the crowds "Forty days from now Nineveh will be destroyed". The people of Nineveh believed Gods message and from the greatest to the least they declared a fast and put on burlap to show their sorrow. When the King of Nineveh heard what Jonah was saying he stepped down from his throne and took off his royal robes. He dressed himself in burlap and sat on a heap of ashes. Then the King and his nobles sent this decree throughout the city. "None not even the animals from your herds and flocks may eat or drink anything at all. People and animals alike must wear garments of mourning and everyone must pray earnestly to God. They must turn from their evil ways and stop all their violence. Who can tell Perhaps even yet God may well change his mind and hold back his fierce anger from destroying us. When God saw what they had done and how they had put a stop to their evil ways, he changed his mind and did not carry out the destruction he had threatened. Jonah 3:1-10
