
Last year we spoke about the lent 40acts as promoted by stewardship so on my first day i placed a  $\pounds 2$  coin on the top of a container of baby milk in the local supermarket. This is just one idea. The possibilities for giving are endless and I'm sure that you can think of many acts of kindness over the 40 day period. When giving to others we are



sacrificing something of ourselves albeit in a small way. Jesus established the whole idea of giving himself 2,000 years ago by giving his life on the cross. £2given away hardly matches the cost that Jesus paid for our sin but in these seemingly small loving acts we are being faithful to him.

We now have over 1400 members on our facebook page. On average there are around five postings each day ranging from video sermons ,bible verses quotes and commentaries, worship music, poetry, and

lately we have been receiving cartoons and jokes. Sometimes Christians can seem a bit intense and serious and of course our faith is profound and there are times when we need to show reverence to God but it is also ok to see the funny side of things and laugh at ourselves a little. I love the Adrian Plass books in this respect not least because our faith is not always neat and tidy, there is paradox and tension in the bible whereby we are required to seek Gods guidance in any given situation. Humour can be a useful thing in bringing us to a point of humility before God. If you have not been on our



facebook page yet please give it a look, you are more than welcome to become a member. It is also useful to keep you up to date and informed as to what is happening in our local Christian community. Its just one of many ways in which we can be spiritually nourished.

#### Street Jesus News:

On February 16th Rad and i were interviewed at a breakfast service

at All saints Church Kesgrave by Rev Robin Spittle. It was a very enjoyable morning involving lots of families and the bacon rolls were most welcome. We were able to share the nature of our work and had an opportunity to answer



questions after the service. We were asked about the common reaction of people when talking to them about Jesus. In truth every person is different and reactions range from withdrawing from the conversation and not wanting to know, through to open hostility to God. When talking with somebody we try to practice double listening, seek to discern the spiritual need of the person before us. Its not an exact science and we don't always get it right. Going in too strong, too soon can put somebody off and if we do not show enough confidence we may lose an opportunity to share our faith. Its about trying to discern what the best approach is

We recently had our first outreach of 2020 on Ipswich market, we had lots of conversations with people being able to talk about our faith to a group of young people with whom we struck up a good rapport throughout the day, we shared bibles, 'Why Jesus' booklets as well as Beehive and Street Jesus flyers. By the time you read this e-news we will have been on our training day run by Outreach uk for



evangelists at Charsfield village hall on Saturday February 29th. Some of our team have been to previous sessions and found it very interesting and enjoyable. #### THE FACILITIES

There is the main meeting room (seats up to 40) with a small kitchen area (for drinks and plating food), including washing up facilities and linen, along with glasses, crockery and cutlery for 40 people as well as supplies of tea, coffee and sugar. There is also an electronic organ, keyboard and audio-visual equipment available for use. There are 2 toilets, one of which is wheelchair accessible, and there is space for parking at the front of the building and in close proximity.

A short walk from the chapel is a five acre area of water meadow, preserved as a haven for wildlife by one of the centre's management team. In line with the vision and ethos of HOME, The Quiet Place is also available to individuals and groups on day retreat. You can follow a special trail with reflections or just stroll and sit and ponder. The distinctive wet meadow ecosystem is a natural home to special species of butterflies, birds and dragonflies.

THE VISION

It's a place to find space: time to reflect, to meet, to talk, to be quiet, to recharge batteries, to just 'be'. It's available to everyone, of any faith or none.

Groups or individuals can use it for meetings, retreats, or simply as a base to explore the surrounding area. It's for all who need it. regardless of ability to pay.
