Street Jesus News: Welcome to the November edition of our e-news.

As the evenings become darker we look toward Bonfire night and Christmas and with new Covid 19 restrictions in many parts of the country these celebrations will not be as free as in previous years.

Bonfire night has an interesting history and whilst not a religious festival as such it has deep religious roots. In 1605 Guy Fawkes and

his Catholic co-conspirators attempted to assassinate the protestant King James 1. He was arrested whilst guarding the gunpowder in the cellars under the House of Lords intended to blow up the King and to replace him with a Catholic head of state. The observance of the 5th November Act in 1606 formalised the lighting of bonfires as a celebration. The early years brought a lot of conflict between Protestant and catholic groups and a lot of Anti Catholic sentiment. These differences had their origins in the reformation from which the protestant faith grew. Many people simplistically say that Religion causes more trouble than anything else but the issues raised were important not just for a fuller



understanding of the bible but key to our development as a society. The centrality of Gods grace and our faith in it, allowed us to make our laws and democracy more representative and strengthen ideas of charity. The conflict allowed us to reject authoritarian and coercive ideas based on fear, guilt and on our own utility, the opposite of what Jesus taught. Fear not Jesus said Rest in me. It was only with the event of the printing press in the 1400's that people had been able to read what the bible actually said rather than what the priest told them. This was liberating.

We are living in interesting times with the election of the president of the united states happening next week. President Trump has proved a Marmite figure both across the world and in his own country. He has



played up his own Christian faith which is in sharp contrast to many leaders across the worlds who just don't mention God. He has been filmed in group prayer seeking Gods guidance. But does he represent the Christian faith well What does Jesus think about him? He

has done many things which would be unthinkable to leaders across the world. He wants to make America great again and pledges to put America first before all other nations. I see some parallels with God making the Israelites his chosen people but of course the Jewish people were favoured not just for themselves but were to be a light to

to the rest of the world. The promised land was a place where God would reveal himself in the fulness of his glory through his son Jesus Christ. Donald Trump believes in the free market economy, that everyone should pull themselves up by their bootstraps, he has been

unsympathetic to the plight of the poor, has old fashioned attitudes toward women and is anti the black lives matter movement. He is pro life and anti abortion. Both at home and internationally he has embraced an attitude of conflict particularly toward China, North Korea and Russia although he has tried to do



deals with each he does not support co-operative international institutions like the United Nations and NATO . He is loath to commit American troops to overseas conflict believing that countries should sort out their own problems. He is the first president to talk over the heads of colleagues and communicate directly to the electorate via twitter often offering simple solutions to complex problems. He has been poorly informed about important issues and has presided over a very high level of Covid 19 deaths in the USA, urging people not to wear masks but to carry on working in order to keep the economy going. When balancing the health of the nation against damage to the economy he has favoured the economy citing freedom for people to choose how they respond to the pandemic. The manner in which he speaks to people can be aggressive and disrespectful particularly to news reporters who challenge him and his critics use all the buzz words to describe him Misogynistic, Racist, sexist, supremacist etc So how does his behaviour fit with the teachings of Jesus to be humble loving and graceful?

His supporters would say that America has become too liberal secular and Anti Christian and that this is causing great harm to individuals and that this needs to change. But is being pro life enough politically, if you present yourself in a boastful, vulgar, or divisive way?. We remember the pharisees spouting the law but they were the people group that Jesus criticized the most. Where is the compassion for

those who have made mistakes, are in difficult or abusive relational situations and who are alone and have a tough decision to make.

Those people need to know the spirit of the law

and that it exists for their own wellbeing. They need love, the love that only Christ can give.



We are left to pray for Gods will to be done, that that country may truly be one nation under God as envisaged by its founding fathers.
