Street Jesus News: Welcome to the October edition of our e-news.

It was so good to be out among the public again at the Climate Sunday event at Kingston field Woodbridge, the speeches were quite sobering around the science of climate change and scarily close to what scientists call the tipping point. In the quiz show the tipping point

counters balance precariously over the edge or become positioned in areas which are random and not where you would expect them to go. In the real world it is not a game but equally as unpredictable is where extreme weather will strike, we just know that they are increasing in severity and frequency. The crowd were asked at one stage" Who here has recently



suffered from climate anxiety" A large number of hands went up. This and many other concerns are the backdrop to our daily lives. There is a sense that many of the things we have relied on and felt secure in are now under threat. Fear of Covid, labour and fuel shortages, high energy costs and an unsettled geopolitical landscape are all having an effect on our sense of wellbeing. The Beehive Childrens Foundation (Africa) is now a registered Charity company, has obtained some land in order to build some bungalows and other facilities for the Child mums and their children. We continue to

support the Beehive through our tip runs and selling African crafts but just as important is the "Its not ok" campaign which is aimed at men and the importance of respecting the integrity of a woman's / girls body. We continue to be amazed at the sheer hard work and dedication of Jane Alan and all the staff at the Beehive. We continue to pray that their work will thrive.

We had our Annual General meeting on September 13th and we spoke a

lot about rekindling enthusiasm for our Street work, after an 18 month break you can soon get out of the feel for mission, we wanted to stress the importance of prayer in the process of re-ignition and have set a date of Monday October 4th 7.30 for our next prayer meeting. We will be asking God to keep the flame burning as we plan our programme for the months ahead. The


Book of the month
