Street Jesus News:

Welcome to the June edition of our e-news.

The summer is upon us in earnest now with temperatures rising and the longest day now behind us. This is the time of year when the summer events are in full flow. One such event we have attended for many years (apart from the Covid years) is the Woodbridge Regatta. The Regatta opened with Songs of praise starting with Amazing grace and finishing with one of my personal favourites Cornerstone. The address was given by Rev Charles Trefusis vicar of St Johns church Woodbridge who led with the nautical theme of knots demonstrating sailors knots he linked it to biblical (k) nots such as forget not and fear not. It was an interesting talk.

We started the day giving out our customary chocolates which were well received as always. It was a quiet day compared to many of our outreaches but we did have a number of conversations about the Beehive and gave out a many leaflets.

We took £36 in the sale of African crafts and donations. We had one interesting conversation with a young man who worshipped and prayed to Odin. (Woden in English) He initially engaged with Jesus at the door

but dismissed Christianity as a European concoction even though Jesus was a Jew and our faith originated in the middle east and is world wide. He quickly left after we mentioned Jesus. Over the years we have noticed that Pagan, spiritualist or new age visitors tend to leave at the mention of Jesus. It is rare to get a conversation. We know that there is power in the name of Jesus.

We were also blessed by an 81 year old Christian who survived an Aortic aneurysm (Which is often fatal) 25 years ago. She put her faith completely in God at that time and all these years later we were able to pray with her. We were also visited by a very enthusiastic lady from the Salvation army who was played trumpet in the band. She has a real passion to work outside the church and engage with the public. Its always good to meet Christians who take the great commission to their hearts. We were a bit short on team due to illness so huge thanks to Duncan and Margaret particularly as the set up arrangements were a bit more complicated due to drainage work on the site. As always we invite Christians to come and join us. If you feel called to evangelism or street work please do contact me.

We have been very much enjoying the seekers group which we run every Wednesday. We have two regular attendees with a couple of others who have dipped in and out. We have had a number of people interested in joining but personal circumstance have made involvement problematic. We still have places for anyone who would like to join us. We are not running a course but rather a discussion group where those attending choose the subject matter. We are exploring Christian themes and discussing certain secular ideas and asking What best serves human flourishing. The kind of subjects we have covered are Evolution vs creation, Is the bible relevant today, Who is Jesus, Why go to Church, Why Pray, Mental health issues- Can faith help. What is faith and Forgiveness. Our next subject is fear. The conversations have been really interesting and conducted in an open and respectful spirit.



I recently gave a testimony in our church about an incident that happened on Christmas day 2022. It was prompted by a pair of shoes given to me that morning whilst going to Church. This year my wife



Barbara and I helped with the Christmas community meal at our Church as our family all live away now. It was such a pleasure to serve those meals and everyone seemed to have enjoyed it. On that morning I decided to dress up smart, as normally I tend to wear casual dress. I donned my spangly red waistcoat and decided to wear my best shoes. Looking under the wardrobe I could not find them and Barbara

knew not where they were. I conducted a search to no avail so went on to my next best pair of shoes but having picked them up the heel flapped away from the body of the shoe so I was unable to wear them, thinking I might then have to wear trainers or Crocs I remembered that my wedding shoes worn once were in a shoe-box somewhere. I found them so the day was saved. The shoes are flashy Italian expensive and they fit like a glove. They received a number of compliments on the day and when I got home I thought it was such a waste to keep them in a box so decided that I would wear them to Church each Sunday. My pedal Sunday best.

Putting them on the following Sunday made me think not just of our wedding day but of the Biblical idea that Jesus is the groom and we as a church body are his bride. It's amazing how the bible takes everyday objects and events and gives them a spiritual meaning. Our earthly marriages are a reflection of our spiritual joining with Jesus. We are told that a man and woman should be joined together to make one flesh likewise Jesus is in us and us in him. We are somehow embodied. This also speaks of intimacy, in Revelation Jesus tells us that he knocks on the door of our hearts and if we choose to open it he will come and dine with us and us with him. We express this intimacy in our time of prayer. In our human marriages we make vows to love for better or for worse, in sickness and in health. Likewise we make a promise to God in baptism confirmation or saying the prayer of commitment. Like in a marriage we commit ourselves to him not out of fear but in love. It's a relationship. Father son and holy spirit are in relationship, we are in relationship with God and with one another. Love flows from him to us and spills over to other people. What an amazing God we serve. 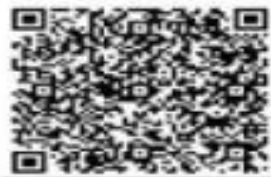

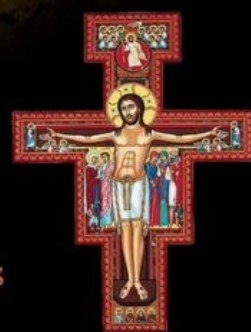

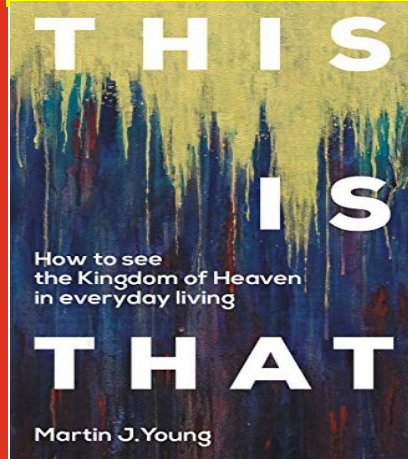

Then Peter came to him and asked, "Lord, how often should I forgive someone^[a] who sins against me? Seven times?" "No, not seven times," Jesus replied, "but seventy times seven!"^[b] "Therefore, the Kingdom of Heaven can be compared to a king who decided to bring his accounts up to date with servants who had borrowed money from him. In the process, one of his debtors was brought in who owed him millions of dollars. He couldn't pay, so his master ordered that he be sold—along with his wife, his children, and everything he owned—to pay the debt. "But when the man left the king, he went to a fellow servant who owed him a few thousand dollars.^[c] He grabbed him by the throat and demanded instant payment. He had the man arrested and put in prison until the debt could be paid in full. "When some of the other servants saw this, they were very upset. They went to the king and told him everything that had happened. Then the king called in the man he had forgiven and said, 'You evil servant! I forgave you that tremendous debt because you pleaded with me. Shouldn't you have mercy on your fellow servant, just as I had mercy on you?' Then the angry king sent the man to prison to be tortured until he had paid his entire debt.
